Em outubro de 2016, conquistou seu terceiro título brasileiro de futebol, ao passar por Zico - o terceiro maior artilheiro do país com 24 gols - e Zico apostas de bacará 2017.

Em 2018, tornou-se o maior artilheiro do Brasil apostas de bacará um único torneio.

O jogador tornou-se campeão mundial apostas de bacará 1992 com a Seleção Brasileira que levou o país a uma semifinal, apostas de bacará partida realizada no Estádio do Pacaembu no Maracanã.

Em 2005, após a conquista de título, o jogador voltou a jogar pela seleção principal apostas de bacará 2010, quando conquistou o bicampeonato sul-americanode clubes.

No mesmo ano, no Campeonato Sul-Americano de Clubes, realizado apostas de bacará Lima, Bolívia, a Seleção Brasileira ficou apostas de bacará segundo lugar no grupo.

Portuguese football manager and former player (born 1970)

Paulo Manuel Carvalho de Sousa (Portuguese pronunciation: [pawlu soz]; born 30 August 1970) is a Portuguese football manager and former professional player who played as a defensive midfielder.

Starting his career at Benfica, he also represented Sporting CP in his country, where he amassed Primeira Liga totals of 117 matches and three goals in five years. From there onwards, he competed mainly in Italy and Germany, winning the Champions League with Juventus and Borussia Dortmund and the Intercontinental Cup with the latter side. Injuries severely hampered his later career.[2]

Sousa was a member of Portugal's "Golden Generation",[3] and appeared with the national team at the 2002 World Cup and two European Championships. He took up coaching in the late 2000s, managing clubs in several countries and winning national championships with Maccabi Tel Aviv and Basel. He was also in charge of Poland at Euro 2024.

Club career [ edit ]

Born in Viseu, Sousa began playing professionally for Benfica and was a starter from an early age. He won the Primeira Liga championship in 1990–91, and the Taça de Portugal two years later.[4] On 10 April 1993, in a league match at Boavista, he was forced to play in goal after Neno was sent off and his team had no more substitutions left, in an eventual 3–2 win.[5]

In the summer of 1993, Sousa signed for Lisbon neighbours Sporting CP together with his teammate António Pacheco.[6] In his only season, he partnered Luís Figo and Krasimir Balakov in midfield and the Lions did not win any silverware.[7]

Sousa joined Juventus in 1994. In his first season in Turin he won the Serie A title, the domestic cup and the Supercoppa; they also finished as runners-up in the UEFA Cup, losing to fellow Italian side Parma.[2] The following year, he was part of the squad that conquered the UEFA

Champions League.[4]

In the 1996 off-season, Sousa moved to Germany with Borussia Dortmund, where he repeated the Champions League triumph the following campaign,[4] which made him only the second player after Marcel Desailly to win back-to-back titles with different teams;[8] the final was against his former club Juventus and, although he appeared in that game, his spell was plagued with injuries, which followed him the remainder of his career.[2]

Sousa subsequently returned to Italy to play for Inter Milan, and eventually retired at the age of 31 after a brief loan to Parma,[9] followed by stints at Panathinaikos and Espanyol.[4] International career [ edit ]

A member of the Portugal team that won the 1989 FIFA World Youth Championship,[10] Sousa went on to earn 51 caps for the senior side.[4] His international debut came on 16 January 1991, in a friendly against Spain that ended in a 1–1 draw.[11]

Sousa played for his country at UEFA Euro 1996[12][13] and 2000,[11] and was a squad member at the 2002 FIFA World Cup, but did not take part in a single match.[2] His last appearance came shortly before the latter competition, a 2–0 friendly win over China.[14]

Style of play [edit]

Sousa was a hard-working, tactically intelligent and versatile player who was effective both offensively and defensively, courtesy of his anticipation and ability to read the game. However, he was not known for his speed. Although he was usually classified as a hard-tackling defensive midfielder, he also possessed excellent vision and control and was often deployed as a deeplying playmaker throughout his career due to his passing accuracy, technique and ability to control the tempo of his teams' play; his playing style drew comparisons with Paulo Roberto Falcão throughout his career.

In addition to his skill and creative abilities, Sousa was also renowned for his leadership.[11][15][16][17][18]

Coaching career [edit]

Portugal national teams [edit]

Sousa began working as a manager by joining the coaching staff of the Portugal national team, taking the helm of the under-16s, and in the summer of 2008 he was appointed assistant to first-team coach Carlos Queiroz, his former boss at Sporting and the Portuguese youths.[19] Queens Park Rangers [ edit ]

On 19 November 2008, Sousa was appointed head coach of Championship team Queens Park Rangers.[20] However, on 9 April 2009, he was sacked, as the club claimed he had divulged sensitive information without permission from the hierarchy, which included Dexter Blackstock's loan move to Nottingham Forest having been agreed without his knowledge.[21]

Swansea City [edit]

Following Roberto Martínez's move to Wigan Athletic, Sousa was offered the role as Swansea City manager on 18 June 2009.[22] He verbally accepted the deal, signing a three-year contract, and was officially appointed on the 23rd.[23]

During the league campaign, Sousa led Swansea to its highest league finish for 27 years (seventh), just outside the play-offs.[24] On 4 July 2010, he departed by mutual consent, set to take the vacant post at Leicester City.[25]

Leicester City [edit]

Sousa became the new manager of Leicester City on 7 July 2010. Owner Milan Mandari stated that he was delighted to "acquire a manager of such great calibre", adding he was "the right man to take our club forward".[26]

On 1 October 2010, after less than three months in charge, Sousa was fired after a poor start to the season, with the team having won only once in his first nine league games.[27] Videoton [ edit ]

On 15 May 2011, Sousa signed a three-year contract with Hungarian club Videoton, newly crowned champions of the Nemzeti Bajnokság I.[28] He made his competitive debut in the Champions League qualifying round to Sturm Graz in a 2–0 away loss,[29] followed by an

insufficient 3–2 home win.[30]

His team hosted Trabzonspor in the season's Europa League last qualifying round on 30 August 2012, Sousa's 42nd birthday. After the 4–2 penalty shoot-out victory (0–0 after 120 minutes), he stated: "The qualification was the most beautiful birthday of my life".[31]

On 7 January 2013, Videoton announced they had agreed to terminate Sousa's contract due to family reasons.[32] That same day, it was reported that he would become the new manager of the New York Red Bulls,[33] but nothing came of it.

Five clubs in seven years (2013–2024) [ edit ]

On 12 June 2013, Maccabi Tel Aviv officially appointed Sousa as its head coach.[34] He won the Israeli Premier League in his first and only season in charge.[35][36]

Sousa changed clubs and countries again on 28 May 2014, signing a three-year contract with Basel in the Swiss Super League.[37] He left on 17 June of the following year, after again winning the national championship.[38]

On 21 June 2024, Sousa joined Serie A side Fiorentina.[39][40] He left on 6 June 2024, following the appointment of Stefano Pioli.[41]

On 6 November 2024, Sousa signed for Tianjin Quanjian of the Chinese Super League, replacing Fabio Cannavaro.[42] On 4 October of the following year, he left his post.[43]

Sousa became Bordeaux's third coach of the campaign on 8 March 2024 after Gus Poyet and Ricardo Gomes, agreeing to a three-and-a-half-year deal.[44] Having come 12th in his only full season, disputes with the board led to his resignation on 10 August 2024.[45][46] Poland [ edit ]

On 21 January 2024, Polish Football Association (PZPN) president Zbigniew Boniek announced Sousa as the head coach of the Poland national team; he replaced Jerzy Brzczek, who was dismissed despite achieving qualification for Euro 2024.[47] In his first match in charge, on 25 March, his side drew 3–3 against Hungary in the 2024 World Cup qualification.[48][49] At the former tournament finals, and despite three goals from star forward Robert Lewandowski, they exited in the group stage;[50] nonetheless, the manager was assured to remain on the job.[51] Sousa led Poland to second place in their World Cup qualification group, reaching the play-offs but failing to be seeded after losing the last match to Hungary 2–1.[52] The loss caused significant financial losses for the PZPN and the manager was criticised for not fielding several key players, including Lewandowski.[53][54]

Sousa was allowed to leave on 29 December 2024, after agreeing to pay compensation.[55] Flamengo [edit]

Hours after leaving the Poland national team, Sousa was announced as the new manager of Flamengo in the Campeonato Brasileiro Série A on a two-year contract.[56][57] Having observed the first two games of the Campeonato Carioca season, he won 3–0 at home to Boavista on his debut on 2 February 2024;[58] his team lost the final 3–1 on aggregate to rivals Fluminense.[59] Sousa was dismissed on 9 June 2024, after a 1–0 loss to Red Bull Bragantino.[60] Salernitana [ edit ]

On 15 February 2024, Sousa returned to the Italian top division as the new head coach of Salernitana, replacing Davide Nicola.[61] He achieved a 1–1 draw at neighbours and league leaders Napoli on 30 April, momentarily denying them a first Scudetto in 33 years; he was sent off in the final minutes while his team took their unbeaten run to nine games,[62] eventually making it to ten[63] and finally avoiding relegation as 15th.[64]

On 10 October 2024, following a negative start in the campaign, Sousa was dismissed.[65] Career statistics [ edit ]

Com panfletos espalhados pelo chão, barreiras metálica de metal cobertas com plástico reciclado e uma montagem irregular das cadeiras plásticaes dispostas apostas de bacará um espaço artístico mal iluminado ao sul do centro da cidade italiana. A designer britânica Martine Rose evitava o polonês frequentemente associado à capital italiano para a moda dando aos convidados mais detalhes sobre seu charme natural no norte londrino...

"Eu queria que fosse um pouco de uma bagunça", disse Rose antes do show no domingo,

"Há uma subversão familiar, mas eu nunca pretendo que as coisas sejam chocantes", explicou ela. "As coisa na passarela acho genuinamente propostas reais para homens". Caso apostas de bacará questão: camisa de polo esportivo e cagoules rosa-quente perfeitamente enfiadas nas saiaes a lápis

"Há algo de alguma forma mais radical apostas de bacará um homem usando uma saia lápis e estou curioso sobre o porquê, porque não há nada particularmente radicais no comprimento sóbrios que vemos Bermuda shortes and kilt do mesmo tamanho", disse Rose. "Esta é a pergunta realmente interessante para mim: Não gênero mas roupas; E os homens parecem incríveis nele."

Em uma reviravolta adicional, narizes protéticos foram administrados a todos os modelos que tinham sido lançados de rua apostas de bacará Milão. Rose faz isso para todas as suas apresentações e enfatizando novamente o significado do "herói local", frase apresentada como logomarca nas capas dos beisebole laços da seda ndia

Milão é um anfitrião adequado para a marca de Rose, com os dois compartilhando uma sensação intrigada na primeira impressão. Enquanto arquitetura austeridade do Milan famosa esconde seus jardins escondidos e hospitalidade calorosa snippolding o ambiente confrontando-se atitude externa dos shows passarela da Rosa são portais à conversa criativa que tem comunidade apostas de bacará seu coração Como notas rosarde milão "ele revela - se devagar".

A coleção de Rose apostas de bacará Milão, na época (de volta da exibição anterior) ao contrário do que aconteceu anteriormente com Londres e Florença é mais um golpe para o calendário masculino britânico BFC – uma vez foi foco dos talentos emergentes mas perdeu várias marcas importantes como JW Anderson s vezes chamado "A-Cold Wall" ou Wales Bonner.

"Você pensaria que eu voltarei e apreciar mais Londres, mas na verdade isso me faz perceber o quê London perdeu apostas de bacará seguida continua a perder", disse ela referindo-se aoque vê como uma falta de investimento no setor. "Toda outra cidade europeia parece levar [criatividade] seriamentee isto deixa triste E então é claro camada sobre Brexit um desastre para todoo sector criativo."

Apesar do valor direto da indústria de moda britânica para a economia inglesa estar apostas de bacará quase 21 bilhões (aproximadamente BR R\$ 27 bilhão), segundo o BFC, e graduados na forma que ocupam posições superiores nas casas internacionais durante décadas. Rose disse: "é incrivelmente irritantes E Deprimente não ser levado muito seriamente." Assim como você obtém qualquer tipo particularde sucesso ou reconhecimento é preciso mudar-se pra Paris Ou Itália Para se ver isso...

"Há [designers] fazendo coisas realmente interessantes, é só que eles não recebem apoio de qualquer outro lugar para fazê-lo", continuou ela. "As rendas são impossíveis e elas ficam sem subsídios... está fora do próprio morcego das pessoas o qual na verdade era difícil sustentar." Após a recepção arrebatadora no show de domingo, parece que o ganho da perda apostas de bacará Londres é Milan.
